Particularly with Hayle's industrial heritage, the authenticity of the heritage is rooted in local people's living memory. Therefore policies will ensure the local community is involved in heritage assessments. These assessment should be used to inform how best to preserve heritage and mitigate harmful impacts. Within the World Heritage Site, policies will ensure that development conserves and presents the inscribed Outstanding Universal Value, and also focuses on job creation and leisure and tourism activities. Development will have to acknowledge the needs of local cultural groups and events. Loss of traditional shop fronts and the use of internally illuminated signs in heritage areas will be resisted. The heritage values of Hayle's ornamental landscapes are to be protected and enhanced while public access is improved.



Land Use



Under the Cornwall Local Plan, Hayle is required to provide space for 1400 new dwellings up to the year 2030. Because there are already outstanding planning consents for a large number, including over 800 in the harbour area, the additional land allocation requirement is for between 200 and 400 dwellings.

Within Hayle's parish boundaries, the largest areas of land for expansion are the fields between the A30 and St George's Road. Previous work by Cornwall Council under the Hayle Town Framework has already identified these areas.

There are, however, problems with traffic bottlenecks within Hayle, particularly around Penpol Road and Foundry Square and the Town Council has expressed a desire to prioritise which areas are developed first.

The map above shows several areas which are meant to indicate approximate locations. They are not accurate, the boundaries will change and some parts will be excluded from development. They are:

- Trevassack which can be developed soon
- Penpol which could be developed but which the Town Council wishes to delay until new road infrastructure is available

- Highlanes/Burnthouse Lane which is unlikely to be available for development in the short term
- School Expansion an area that should be protected for school expansion
- Transport Links these lines show a very approximate alignment of a new road that would link from Mellanear Road on the west to Guildford Road on the east and provide improved links for any new developments in these areas.

The recommended priorities are:

- School Expansion this area shall be designated for the expansion or rebuilding of Penpol School.
- Trevassack ensuring that existing sports facilities are maintained or improved and that any land needed for expansion at Bodriggy Academy is protected.
- Barview/Burnthouse Lane this area can be developed when it is available.
- Penpol this area **should not be developed** until an access road is available that does not require entry onto Penpol Road.
