Projects and Events Officer Report to Full Council July 2023

Hayle Community Action Group

The next meeting of HCAG is arranged for **7pm** on **Tuesday 25th July** at **The Old Foundry Chapel.** Members are invited to come along to look at and comment on the master plan. The meeting will be focused on the master plan and what the group's next steps should be with it. The master plan is a working document so it will be an opportunity to voice any issues and concerns.

At the last meeting the group decided to make the recommendation to become a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) with the caveat that the group seek information about VAT.

Events

Meeting for Retail, Hospitality and Tourism businesses

A meeting was held for retail, tourism and hospitality businesses on 6th June to explore practical ways to drive footfall and increase dwell time in the town. Although there weren't high numbers of people in attendance, the businesses did represent a range of views and sectors. There was a great deal of discussion around the issues and the positive things in Hayle.

The following key issues were identified by the group:

- Traffic flow through the town
- Lack of parking, particularly affecting Copperhouse
- Litter and vandalism particular places seem to be a real problem
- Issue of overgrown back streets lots of dog poo and drug paraphernalia concern that this is where drug deals are made due to the pathways being unmaintained
- Home Bargains car park needs cleaning up of litter and could be made much better use of as barely used due to time limit of parking there
- Need better connections between parts of the town, including safe pedestrian routes and cycle paths to the beaches along with links to campsites to bring tourists into Hayle
- Build up of moss at certain parts of the town can this be cleaned up? Particular problem identified in Copperhouse
- 1 Fore Street through to Copperhouse people don't like walking along there
- Sense that police don't attend when there is an issue
- Need better communication between businesses and with council
- Lack of identity branding needed
- Lack of signage
- Flytipping

The following actions were decided:

• branding the town for residents and visitors to highlight the town's story is and why people should come here (e.g. our heritage and USPs) "The Town with Two Hearts"

- running a shuttle bus to connect up the parts of the town and bring people from the beaches and holiday parks into the shopping area
- improve signage linking up the parts of the town
- ideas for key sites which may help to reduce anti-social behaviour
- bike lock-ups in Foundry and Copperhouse to encourage active travel and to get around demand for parking
- signs to encourage people to take their litter home in order to develop behaviour change and encourage greater pride in the town
- resurrect some old events, e.g. raft race, foundry day start as small community events and grow them

The group were also introduced to the Discover app window stickers, digital trails and signs.

A new Good Growth (Shared Prosperity) fund has been released in the last two weeks that may be appropriate to apply for as it could fund some of the things that were suggested, e.g. a shuttle bus, shopping/heritage trails and so on.

In a strangely timely way, Bodriggy Academy have been in touch with Ellie (as you will have seen) to request that the children design posters to encourage people to change behaviour around litter.

Hayle Health and Wellbeing Festival/Community Showcase

Invitations have been sent out to organisations, societies, groups and clubs to take part in the Health and Wellbeing Festival with Community Showcase on $23^{rd} - 24^{th}$ September. Invitations have also been sent out to businesses and organisations to provide activities. A plan has been drawn up for panel discussions and the social prescriber from Bodriggy Surgery has been consulted about ideas and contacts.

The plan of activities should be ready to be published at the end of July. Save the date marketing will begin prior to the publication of the programme.

More than Words Project

The Sensory Trust and Hayle Heritage Centre will be launching their sensory trail on Sunday 9th July. Please see the attached event outline for full details.

Funding

Shared Prosperity Fund

Connecting Communities: Community Organisation Fund

Last month the Expression of Interest for this fund was accepted and we can now proceed to the next stage. The Projects and Events Officer is putting together the full application with input from other officers and members for funding for the Relocation Project. The application requires full costings and linking to local and national strategy.

CIL Funding

The Project and Events Officer submitted an expression of interest for CIL funding for the Recreation Ground. We are awaiting a response from Cornwall Council to see if we can complete the full application. This was informed by the work completed so far on the master plan in order to get an idea of costs of play equipment.

Community Ownership Fund

The Projects and Events Officer attended three webinars that explained the Community Ownership Fund. The Fund (£150 million across the UK over three years) is in its third round and some changes have been made for this round enabling Town and Parish Council's to apply. The fund is available for assets that are at risk of loss to the community and applications for up to £1 Million can be made, although in reality applications should be up to £250,000 unless an exceptional case can be made for over that amount. The assets can be anything from sporting assets to buildings and pieces of land that have importance to the community. Buildings do not have to be listed, they can just be of historical importance to the people of a town. The money can be used to conserve an asset that is already in our ownership. They have also altered the amount of match-funding required in this phase, reducing it from 50% - 20%.

This is definitely worth looking at as there are a number of Hayle assets that may be applicable for the fund.

HM July report to the Town Council

South Quay

The collapse of the South quay wall is the result of voids being created behind the stone when the fines are sucked out of the wall joints by the tide. Previously when the quay surface was gravel a hole used to appear when it collapsed into the void which was filled.

Now that a concrete pad forms the quay surface we do not know when these voids occur until there is a collapse of the wall. It is evident that this is going to be an ongoing problem, so the harbour owner and harbour authority have given considerable thought as to how we deal with this collapse and future repairs.

The result of that discussion is that our preferred method of repair to prevent continued wash out of the fines is to sheet pile which will be faced with the stone from the collapse. The sheet piling will be tied back into the quay and back filled with aggregate and the concrete surface re-laid.

Owing to the listed status of the quay I have discussed this repair method with CC heritage officer Colin Buck who has asked that I generate a method statement and drawings for consideration by Historic England who have to sign off the repair process. Colin suggested that the vibration method should be used to drive in the sheets as opposed to hammering which should reduce the shockwave to the remaining wall.

Dave Slater former CC planning officer is assisting with the method statement, and I have asked two engineering companies for quotes to produce the necessary drawings.

If approved, the intention is to complete the repair using inhouse staff and equipment from the construction site.

Vandalism

Recent vandalism by youths around the harbour is becoming a problem and public have returned life rings that have been removed which were found on the beach. We have reported this to the police and Alix my deputy has also written a report for the local media.

Hayle Harbour, set within a cherished coastal town, has fallen victim to a series of acts of vandalism, causing concern among the staff and authorities alike. It is believed that a group of youths is responsible for the ongoing incidents, which have escalated in recent weeks. The Hayle community is now calling for increased vigilance and swift action to put an end to the destructive behaviour.

The primary targets of these vandals have been the life rings located on North Quay. These essential safety devices, designed to save lives in emergency situations, have been tampered with causing concern to their integrity and some rendered useless. This reckless act not only endangers the lives of those who rely on these crucial safety measures but also reflects a disregard for the well-being of the entire community. Furthermore, the perpetrators have brazenly entered the locked fisherman's compound, trespassing on private property, vandalizing buildings within, and even taking bait fish from the area. The unauthorized removal of bait fish raises serious concerns regarding public health

and safety. These fish are not fit for human consumption and consuming them could potentially lead to illness.

To aid in the investigation, local authorities have obtained CCTV footage capturing the individuals believed to be responsible for these destructive acts. The footage will be handed over to the police for further examination and identification. Hayle Harbour hope that this evidence will facilitate a swift resolution and the apprehension of those involved.

The monetary impact of the vandalism cannot be ignored, with the total damages amounting to over £600 within the past six weeks alone. These financial losses not only burden the community but also divert valuable resources that could be allocated elsewhere for the betterment of Hayle Harbour and its surroundings.

Concerned residents and local businesses are now rallying together, calling for increased police presence and security measures to deter such incidents in the future. They emphasize the importance of proactive measures to safeguard the cherished heritage of Hayle Harbour, protect public health, and maintain a safe environment for residents and visitors alike. Local authorities have been urged to take immediate action in addressing the recurring acts of vandalism, strengthening security protocols, and working closely with the community to prevent future occurrences. Increased patrols and targeted interventions are needed to curb the escalating damage and ensure that those responsible are held accountable.

Hayle Harbour has long been a symbol of community pride and economic prosperity. It is crucial that everyone comes together to protect this cherished area from the destructive actions of a few individuals. By working collaboratively, residents, authorities, and law enforcement can send a clear message that vandalism, trespassing, and potential health risks will not be tolerated, ensuring a brighter and safer future for Hayle Harbour and its surrounding community.

Report on the response to Hayle Town Council's request for support regarding the dumping of sewage in our seas.

History

At the Full Council Meeting of 15 December 2022. Hayle Town Council considered writing in support of Cornwall Council to the Secretary of State, South West Water and the Environment Agency regarding holding the water companies to account on the dumping of sewage in our seas.

It was resolved that Hayle Town Council write in support of Cornwall Council (CC) and to reach out to other councils through the Cornwall Association of Local Councils (CALC).

(CALC were unable to carry out the request on behalf of HTC).

Newquay declared a Climate Emergency against sewage last year (*See attachment*) and are currently working with South West Water centred around engagement and awareness. Further details have been requested and they have forwarded our contact details to the SWW officer concerned.
