Mayor's Sponsored Walk

Despite the rain over 70 people participated in the sponsored walk on Sunday 3 September to raise funds for Cornwall Hospice Care, incorporating St Julia's Hospice. Money is still coming in and it seems likely that over £5,000 will be raised. Thank you to everyone who took part in or supported the Mayor's Sponsored Walk. Hayle Open Air Swimming Pool

The pool finally closed on 24 September following an extension for two extra weekends, which rounded off a very successful 2017 season. The extensive refurbishments, including the new entrance, new windows and doors, and the repainting of fences and benches, were worth all the hard work put in by staff and volunteers. The new solar covers successfully often raised the water temperature to a balmy 25 to 26 degrees Celsius, with the lowest recorded being 21 degrees. Final usage figures for the pool are expected to be over 5,000 users, many of whom had season tickets. The Tuesday evenings adult only lane swimming proved to be a great success and that and the hiring of the pool on Saturday evenings by the local surf lifesaving club for club training increased the usage and profile of the pool. Tuesdays by and large were the busier days due to the continuation of the free Tuesday passes for TR27 residents.

Recreation Ground

The installation of the new inclusive play roundabout at the Recreation Ground has unfortunately been delayed, but we hope that it will be available in November.

CCTV

The two additional CCTV cameras have now been installed by SSE. They cover the Recreation Ground and the far end of Copperhouse and the Penpol Terrace, harbour and Jubilee Bridge areas.

Hayle Civic Service and Parade

This year's event will take place on Sunday 8 October and as usual the Parade will meet and form in the Commercial Road Car Park from 2.30pm. Guests are invited to park in the car park and the Parade will process to St Elwyn's Church for the Civic Service, which starts at 3pm. Following the Service the Parade will return to the Day Care Centre for refreshments.
