And offer a warm welcome to our two new Cornwall Councillors, Councillor Channon and Pascoe, who we are keen to work closely with when continuing to promote the priorities of Hayle and its residents at County level, using all of the resources available to them at that level. One of the first and main priorities for me for example, and for the concerned residents that have contacted me recently will be to continue the hard work already undertaken by Councillor Pollard, for our King George V Memorial Walk, the stabilisation of the cliff and maintenance of the roadway.

Further priorities for me will be to promote and raise awareness to the public of the work and services provided by our council, to hopefully extend and enhance some of our existing facilities and provision of services. By doing so we will make the Council and those facilities more accessible to residents, councillors and visitors alike and which I hope will draw more people in and to use those facilities, building further on the successes made by previous Council.
